'Charities often seek sponsorship when they are really looking for a donation' said Ellen Gunning, the Academy's Director, 'and companies who sponsor for small amounts of money often feel uncomfortable negotiating the return on their investment' she added.

Whether you are a company looking to invest, or an organisation seeking a sponsor, this video will show you how to go about it. It explains what sponsorship can realistically deliver for your organisation, and looks at the difference between sponsorship and charity.

The video includes some great footage from Chambers Ireland CSR Awards (the Academy were past winners) and the BT Young Scientist Exhibition. It is a useful tool for anyone seeking sponsorship funding from a third party.

Almost everything now is sponsored: sports, art, books, exhibitions, concerts, television broadcasts and even the weather! PR Practitioners and Event Managers need to understand how to negotiate sponsorship deals for their clients.
